Investment Gap Between EMs, Developed World Shrinking, Says Professor Russell Napier

Compared with the developed world, India has done a 'spectacularly good job' and is being rewarded with capital inflows, he said.



The scale of investment has picked up and there is plenty of room to go for more investments and intangible productive assets in India, along with the rest of the emerging markets and also the developed world, according to Professor Russell Napier. "Things are definitely different for India post-Covid," Napier said. After the pandemic, India stands out because of the Reserve Bank of India, he said. "And, in due course, we will be writing books about how well the RBI handled the Covid crisis, much better than the Bank of England and the European central bank."
